Job search and apply for international organizations and NGOs

Academics with intercultural experience, with interest in global issues and keen to work in international teams, are likely to aspire to a position in an international organization. This weekend seminar seeks to give the participants some orientation concerning the possibilities, perspectives and prerequisites for a professional future in civil society/international organizations.

On Saturday morning we will start working on a strategy for a successful career entry especially for international students: We will discuss what steps you have to take when entering the job market. We will then go on working on application documents and answer questions such as:

What does a proper CV look like? What do I need to consider when writing a cover letter? We will work hands-on with concrete examples to develop content and format of a professional application.

Speakers from different organizations will share their experiences and give helpful hints for the participants. Useful files will be handed out. We will care for spaces for reflection, action, discussion and recreation.

The heterogeneous character of the group of participants from all over the world and from different backgrounds will enrich the exchange on the issue.

Students enrolled in higher semesters and graduates of all subjects/areas of study are invited to join in for a cheerful weekend with like-minded people who consider working in the non-profit-sector.
